



# Welsh Home International Team Rules

## 1. Welsh Team Selection Procedure.

- a. Each discipline shall hold a number of selection shoots every year. Any member who hasn't competed in the minimum number of shoots required for selection will not be eligible for the team. The minimum number of shoots required to be eligible for the team is equal to the number of scores to count as outlined below:

Discipline	Qualifying Shoots	Scores to Count
ABT	8	4
DTL	8	4
Sporting	8	4
Olympic Skeet	6	3
National Skeet	8	4
Olympic Trap	6	4
FITASC	5	3

- b. Team selection is on a points basis, the highest Welsh member eligible for the team taking 0 points, and points added for each shooter dependent on their score from the high gun score.
- c. The members who have the lowest points of the scores to count shall be selected for the team provided that they meet all the qualifying criteria.
- d. Members who qualify for the team in more than one category shall shoot for the category that will allow Wales to field the strongest team possible.
- e. WCTSA/CPSA rules will apply to all competitions and any conduct unbecoming of an association member will be reported to the Executive Committee and may result in disciplinary action.

## 2. Team Composition

- a. The Welsh team for each discipline shall consist of:

### 3. Ties

- a. If team places are tied a shoot off system will apply. For all disciplines other than Sporting a full round of 25 shall be shot (for Sporting 10 targets shall be shot not 25). If the position is not resolved after the first round a second round shall be shot. If there is still a tie after the second round then single barrel sudden death shall be shot until a result is obtained.

### 4. Minimum Qualifying Scores (MQS)

- a. The shooter must have shot one competition with a score equal to or higher than the following minimum qualifying score:

### 5. Shooter Age limits

- a. Junior Members - Must be under 21 on 1<sup>st</sup> January in the year of the final.
- b. Veteran Members - Must be 55 or over on 1<sup>st</sup> January in the year of the final.
- c. Super Veterans - Must be 65 or over on 1<sup>st</sup> January in the year of the final.

### 6. Registration of Scores

- a. All selection shoot scores shall be registered with the CPSA.

### 7. Levies

- a. Levies to be collected at Selection Shoots
  - i. £3 per shooter for Seniors, Ladies, Veterans and Super Veterans.
  - ii. £1 per Junior.

### 8. Eligibility

- a. Shooters must be fully paid up members of the WCTSA.
- b. Membership must be paid BEFORE a selection shoot starts, any member who has not renewed their membership will NOT have their scores recorded.
- c. To shoot for Wales a member must meet one of the following criteria:
  - i. Born in Wales
  - ii. Parents/Grandparents Born in Wales
  - iii. Have lived in Wales for more than 2 years

### 9. Jury

- a. At all selection shoots a Jury is to be selected in accordance with WCTSA rules. The jury's decision will be final.
