



# **WELSH CLAY TARGET SHOOTING ASSOCIATION**

## **CURRENT RULE BOOK**

**Ratified at the WCTSA Board Meeting 5<sup>th</sup> June 2024.**

**This version supersedes all previous versions and is the only version to be referred to.**

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## 1. Purpose

1. The Welsh Clay Target Shooting Association is the governing body of clay target shooting in Wales. Its primary function is to organise, regulate and promote the development of the sport of clay target shooting within Wales. The Association will provide insurance for members while engaged in shooting activities and will try to encourage all those people engaged in shotgun shooting to be insured by becoming members.
2. These rules have been formulated by the WCTSA board for all disciplines and events controlled by them. Technical rules for all disciplines will be those of the ICTSC and CPSA rulebooks.
3. For any events not covered by this rule book the rules of the ICTSC will apply.
4. Any national ISSF or FITASC events held by the WCTSA will be run under the current rules issued by the governing body of that discipline.

## 2. Management

1. The management of the Association is undertaken by the Board.
2. The composition and makeup of the Board is described in the WCTSA articles of association.
3. Election of members to the board is also described in the WC TSA articles of association.
4. Contact details of Board Members shall be displayed on the WCTSA website.
5. The current articles of association of the WCTSA can be found displayed on the WCTSA website.
6. Membership categories and the subscriptions and fees for members joining the Association can be found in Appendix 6 and are also detailed on the WCTSA website.
7. The Board undertakes to ensure there is suitable insurance policies in place to cover its members for shooting sports. The current membership insurance policy documents are available on the WCTSA website.



### 3. Affiliated Shooting Grounds (Membership, Responsibilities, and Levies)

1. All affiliated grounds must appoint a qualified Safety Officer.
2. All affiliated grounds must have an up-to-date health and safety policy.
3. Affiliated clay target shooting grounds wishing to hold Welsh Team selection shoots or sanctioned WCTSA events, (Welsh Open or Grand Prix events etc), shall undergo a ground inspection by a designated member of the Board, using the Boards qualifying criteria. This can be read or is available on the WCTSA website.
4. At the beginning of each calendar year all affiliated grounds must sign the terms and conditions as a requirement of their membership, and to enable them to host sanctioned WCTSA events.
5. Ground affiliation membership fees are due on 1 January each year and clubs will be invoiced by the Treasurer / Secretary of the WCTSA.
6. Any outstanding affiliated ground invoices from the previous year will result in the ground not being eligible to hold shoots the following year.
7. Affiliated grounds must complete and return ALL required documentation in the information pack sent out by the WCTSA Secretary, failure to do so may result in the board not awarding sanctioned WCTSA events applied for by the affiliated ground.
8. It is the duty of the affiliated ground to make sure that all Welsh entrants to a WCTSA sanctioned event and registered shoot are paid-up members of the WCTSA on the day of the shoot.
9. Levies.
  - a. Affiliated grounds must charge every shooter who enters a sanctioned WCTSA event the appropriate levy as outlined in Appendix 1 of this rulebook, this is to include all shooters participating, regardless of country and whether they are shooting competition or birds only.
  - b. The Board will invoice the affiliated ground for the total levies due from any sanctioned WCTSA event such as, but not limited to
    1. County Competitions
    2. Welsh Qualifiers
    3. Welsh Open Competitions



4. Welsh Grand Prix Competitions.
  - c. Details of the current levy charges for the different membership categories can be found in Appendix 1 of this rulebook.
  - d. All levy fees invoiced by the Association are to be returned to the WCTSA treasurer within one month of receipt of the invoice issued by the Treasurer.
10. Affiliated grounds can administer and run WCTSA sanctioned events providing they fully comply with all the provisions contained in this rulebook , and in the rulebook for the discipline concerned and / or any additional conditions approved by the WCTSA.
11. Affiliated grounds must elect a Jury consisting of no less than five persons on the morning of any WCTSA sanctioned event, and a notice displayed at the entry desk giving this information before shooting starts at all registered events. The role of the Jury is that of overseeing the running of the event. They must check at the beginning of a competition and where they feel necessary, reset the targets as per the Technical Rules of the discipline. To carry out the duties and responsibilities allocated to them as per the rulebook of the discipline concerned and to make all decisions directly relating to the fairness of the competition. A Jury levy fee of £25 must be paid for any protest made, if the Jury upholds the protest then the fee shall be returned. Any shooter bringing an issue to the jury must first pay a Jury levy of £25, which will be returned to the shooter in the event of their complaint or issue being upheld. In instances where the issue or complaint is not upheld the Jury Levy must be passed on by the affiliated ground to the WCTSA.
12. It is the responsibility of each affiliated ground to ensure that Welsh participants are current WCTSA members in order that their score can be recorded.
13. Any Association members membership fees collected by affiliated grounds must be passed on in full to the WCTSA treasurer as soon as possible, (within 1 week), to ensure the shooters membership status is updated as soon as possible.
14. Affiliated grounds holding Welsh qualifier fixtures must either register their scores with the CPSA, if they are a CPSA registered ground, or if not ensure that an Excel spreadsheet, or equivalent, of shooter scores is sent to the WCTSA Statistical Officer without delay to ensure updating of international team's places can be completed as soon as possible. Photographs of written scoreboards are not suitable. Failure to do so may result in the withdrawal of either awarded fixtures, or consideration for fixtures in subsequent years.



15. Shooters at WCTSA sanctioned events may not have their finishing scores omitted or hidden from either the results submitted to the WCTSA or from shoot results released on the website or via social media, or when sent to the CPSA for registration purposes.
16. Affiliated grounds holding sanctioned WCTSA events should allow all fully paid-up members of the Association to compete unless that shooter is subject to a specific sanction imposed by the Board.
17. Canvassing or inducements will disqualify any application with regards to tenders or sanctioned WCTSA or ICTSC events.
18. Affiliated grounds must accept the Association's assistance were provided to ensure that the necessary standard of service regarding results and the running of any sanctioned event is consistent with the quality expected of any WCTSA event.
19. Affiliated grounds holding Welsh selection shoots must have functioning ladies and gent's toilet facilities available at all WCTSA sanctioned events.
20. Prize money
  - a. Prize monies to be awarded at a sanctioned WCTSA event must be advertised and displayed by the ground in advance of the event taking place. This need not be actual amounts but must as a minimum be displayed how the prize money will be calculated e.g., based on the number of entries per category and / or classification.
  - b. There will always be a first prize in any lettered class at a WCTSA sanctioned event.
  - c. Guidance on the overall prize fund and how this will be divided can be found in the current CPSA registered shoot rulebook.
  - d. Affiliated grounds must allow 'Targets Only' (TO) entry to WCTSA sanctioned events.
  - e. Prize monies per class will be the difference between the TO entry fee and the competition entry fee. This constitutes the competition prize pot.
  - f. The minimum payback per entry into the prize pot at registered shoots is £5.
  - g. Overall High Gun awards are at the discretion of the ground and must be separate from the prize pot mentioned above.
21. Targets only competitor scores will count towards team selection and classification purposes but will not be eligible for category awards. They may however be considered for an overall high gun award if given by the affiliated grounds.



22. Where an event entrant fails to complete a registered shoot their score and the full levies must still be returned to the WC TSA.
23. Any accident occurring at a WCTSA sanctioned event must be reported to the General Secretary in writing without delay. The Board of a the WCTSA does not accept any liability for any such occurrence at a WCTSA sanctioned event.





## 4. Shooter's Responsibilities

1. The onus is on every member of the Association to promote safety within our sport.
2. It is mandatory for all competitors and other persons in the vicinity of the shooting area at a WCTSA sanctioned event to wear adequate eye and hearing protection.
3. If a shooter is a member of more than one national governing body and has more than one classification shown in any official electronic or printed publication in any given discipline, they will be given the higher of these classifications at a registered event. The shooter must provide this information to the ground,
4. All shooters must ensure completed scorecards are returned to the affiliated ground at WCTSA sanctioned events. Should a shooter for whatever reason fail to complete the shoot their score card must still be submitted back to the affiliated ground for inclusion in the shoot results. Failure to do so may result in disciplinary action.
5. Dress Code
  - a. At all WCTSA events competitors clothing will be expected to be in a clean and tidy condition and should not contain any messages images or slogans that may reasonably cause offence to others. Offensive messages or images of a sexual or racial nature are specifically forbidden, as well as any that break the accepted standards of decency and good taste.

Specific examples of personal appearance or garments that will be considered unacceptable are,

    1. Nakedness of the trunk or limbs other than the lower arms or legs.
    2. Wearing of a shooting vest over naked flesh.
    3. Shirts or tops that have sleeves that when measured from the armpits seam are less than 10 centimetre long (other than shooting vests).
    4. Acceptable shorts must be no more than 6 inches above the knee.
    5. Torn slashed or shredded shirts, jeans, trousers, or skirts.
    6. Military or camouflaged wear.
    7. Any excessively worn dirty or dishevelled clothing or footwear.
    8. Flip-flops or open toed sandals.



9. Any other garment or personal appearance to go against the spirit of this code or that seek to exploit any possible loophole within it, at the discretion of the Jury.
  - b. At any event at which this code is in operation, any participant found to be in breach of any of the provisions contained above shall be told to rectify their appearance without delay. Failure to comply with such instruction will disqualify the offender from further participation in the event, without the right to a refund, and may additionally render them liable to disciplinary action under the WCTSA disciplinary policy.
6. Perpetual cups and trophies
- a. All must be returned to the WCTSA via its discipline reps, or other board members before the next year's event, in sufficient time as to allow presentation at the competition in question. Failure to return the trophy that has been signed for may result in the board obtaining a replacement and billing the shooter in question who was awarded the trophy previous year.
  - b. The holder of a perpetual cup or trophy is responsible for the safekeeping of the same for the period during which they hold the award and will be liable for the loss or damage to the award. All clubs or board members presenting perpetual cups or trophies at shoots must complete the WCTSA Tracker Form and return this to the General Secretary within one week of the event.
  - c. All perpetual cups and trophies presented or donated or sponsored to the WCTSA are accepted and competed for as part of the calendar of events on the basis that they become the property of the Association and its members.



## 5. Board Policies

1. The management board of the WC TSA undertake to provide a policy for the following matters.
  - a. GDP.
  - b. Complaints, Disciplinary and Grievance.
  - c. Bullying and Harassment.
  - d. Safeguarding and Child Protection.
  - e. Whistleblowing
  - f. Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Policy
2. These policies shall be kept up to date and reviewed periodically at a frequency to be set by the Board.
3. These policies can be found on the WCTSA website.



## 6. Discipline Representative Responsibilities

1. The role of a WCTSA. Discipline representative is to be the conduit between the shooters, affiliated grounds, and the Board.
2. To represent the Board at any events attended to act for and on behalf of the WCTSA as they may be the only Board member present.
3. The role is to disseminate information to the affiliated grounds from Board decisions and ensure shooters concerns are brought to the Boards attention.
4. They must attend regular 6 weekly Board meetings, along with the yearly AGM, and any other meetings when called. Routine Board meetings will be held remotely to try and avoid unnecessary travel and expense.
5. They must set the MQS to be used for the next year.
6. They must arrange the fixtures for the Welsh Team qualifiers, Welsh Opens, or Grand Prix, along with any County Finals to be held and help in the organisation of these events on the day.
7. They must ensure that all WCTSA trophies are returned prior to an event, or brought on the day, to ensure that the winners can be presented with their trophies on the day of the competition.
8. They will be involved, along with the General Secretary and the Chairman, with the organising and hosting of any HCIT event held in Wales.



## 7. Welsh Team Selection Procedures

1. Eligibility - criteria for those wishing to represent any Welsh clay target shooting team at an international event under the authority of the ICTSC, ICTSF, or any other sanctioned event where a Welsh team is competing are as follows
  - a. Must be a fully paid-up current competition member of the WCTSA.
  - b. Must comply with at least one of the following criteria
    1. Having been born in Wales.
    2. Having a parent or grandparent to be or have been Welsh.
    3. Having been officially resident in Wales for a minimum continual period of one year prior to qualification.
    4. Be related by marriage to a Welsh National, i.e., married to someone born in Wales, not qualifying under criteria 7.1.b.1 to 7.1.b.3.
  - c. If a shooter has already represented another country in any discipline, they must fully comply with the following ICTSC procedures in addition to the above before being eligible to shoot for Wales.
    1. A minimum period of two years would have to elapse between last shooting for another country and first shooting for Wales.
    2. The shooter would have to obtain for this change full agreement in writing from the WCTSA and the other countries National Association.
    3. The ICTSC must approve this changeover in advance no later in the year than at its February council meeting.
2. HCIT Welsh Team Selection Shoots
  - a. Each discipline will hold selection shoots at affiliated grounds decided by the Board. Affiliated grounds will be invited to apply for the shoots prior to the board selection shoot allocation meeting, held at the end of each year for shoots to be held the following year.
  - b. The number of shoots and the dates of those shoots will be arranged by the discipline representatives and submitted to the board for approval. These dates and venues will then be placed on the WCTSA website and social media platforms. Affiliated grounds may advertise the respective shoot on their own platforms ONLY after they have been announced by the WCTSA.



- c. The selection procedure for each discipline i.e., number of scores to count from the number of selections held can be found in Appendix 2 and will be published on the WCTSA website and social media outlets.
- d. At the last meeting of the calendar year discipline representatives from every discipline will submit an MQS for each membership category to be used for the following year's competitions. A shooter must achieve a MQS in at least one of their scores to count for selection at an international event.  
The current MQS's for each discipline can be found in Appendix 4.
- e. International Status  
Shooters become an international when they have shot for Wales in a WCTSA sanctioned Home International, or when they have represented Wales in another selected team in international competition sanctioned by the WCTSA board. Full international status will be granted to those selected to shoot in the Home International matches. Other competitions such as World and European competitions where Wales are invited to send a representative team may give team members international status if the WCTSA Board ratifies the event is of international status. These other competitions must involve an authentic selection procedure agreed by the board in advance and would be subject to the same minimum qualifying score set above. Shoot entry and expenses etc. may be paid to shooters competing in events other than the Home Internationals, dependent on the discipline representatives submitting a proposal to the Board at the last Board meeting of the calendar year before the event is to be held, and in line with current Board policy on expenses.
- f. Where a discipline has selection shoots held at more than one ground, shooters must include scores from at least 2 different grounds. This is to prevent a shooter from qualifying having only shot at a single ground which may also be their practice ground. The aim of the selection procedure is to have a team comprised of the best shooters overall rather than the best shooters at a particular ground. Any shooter submitting scores from only one ground when at least 2 grounds have held qualifiers will NOT be considered for selection to represent Wales.



Each discipline may introduce their own specific qualifying criteria in addition or instead of the two-ground rule above, provided this is ratified and minuted at a WCTSA Board meeting.

- g. For a shooters Welsh selection shoot score to count for Welsh Team points, the shooter must complete the whole shoot, and have shot at ALL targets presented, e.g. but not limited to 4 x 25 for trap disciplines and FITASC, 100 for sporting etc.

### 3. HCIT Selection Procedure.

- a. Each discipline shall hold a number of selections shoots every year. Any member who hasn't competed in the minimum number of shoots required for selection will not be eligible for the team. The minimum number of shoots required to be eligible for the team is equal to the number of scores to count as outlined in Appendix 2.
- b. Team selection is on a points basis, the highest Welsh member eligible for the team taking 0 points, and points added for each shooter dependent on their score from the Welsh high gun score.
- c. The members who have the lowest points of the scores to count shall be selected for the team if they meet all the qualifying criteria.
- d. Members who qualify for the team in more than one category shall shoot for the category that will allow Wales to field the strongest team possible.
- e. The Welsh team for each discipline shall consist of Seniors, Ladies, Juniors Veterans and Super Veterans. The number of shooters in each category can be found in Appendix 3.
- f. Selection of team members where scores are tied.
  - 1. If team places are tied a shoot off system will apply. For all disciplines other than Sporting a full round of 25 shall be shot (for Sporting 10 targets shall be shot not 25). If the position is not resolved after the first round a second round shall be shot. If there is still a tie after the second round, then single barrel sudden death shall be shot until a result is obtained.
  - 2. Should shooters tied not all be present to shoot off, then the Stats Officer will take the three best qualifier scores for each shooters involved, and the position will go to the shooter with the highest average of their three best scores.



- g. Announcement of the Final Team
  - 1. Official announcement of the Welsh Team for each discipline will be done on the WCTSA website and social media only once scores MQS's and all results have been checked and verified. This will be done as soon as possible but means this will NOT be completed on the day of the last qualifier in a discipline, this to ensure there are no errors with qualifying places.
  - h. When a shooter is offered a place in the Welsh International team, they must reply accepting the invitation and confirming their attendance to the team manager as soon as possible, and at the latest seven days after their team place has been offered.
  
- 4. Course setters in English Sporting and FITASC Sporting who set up a Welsh qualifier course
  - a. Ground owners or target setters are allowed to compete at their own shoots due to the relatively small number of grounds in Wales for these disciplines.
  - b. However, should a ground owner / target setter achieve the highest score on the day, they are not eligible for any High Gun or class category monetary awards.
  - c. Should the ground owner / target setter be High Gun, they are still able to receive 0 points for that shoot, but every other shooter Welsh Team points will be calculated from the next highest Welsh shooters, and not from the ground owner / target setter's score.
  
- 5. Welsh Team Member Standards and Responsibilities
  - a. For any member gaining a Welsh team place it is mandatory to acquire, as a minimum, the official Wales team uniforms described below.
    - 1. Official Team Wales shooting vest, which must be purchased through the WCTSA General Secretary.
    - 2. Official Team Wales polo shirt, which must be purchased through the WCTSA General Secretary.
    - 3. The WCTSA undertakes to provide an official team Wales shooting vest and polo shirt to all new international selected Colt and Junior category shooters.





- b. Shooters newly elected to international status will be provided with a WCTSA cloth and wire badge to be sewn onto a blazer, along with WCTSA official tie or cravat, to be worn with the official dress uniform mentioned below.
- c. Welsh team shooting uniform - while shooting shooters must wear.
  - 1. Official Wales team shooting vest.
  - 2. Official Wales team polo shirt.
  - 3. Shooters are encouraged to wear black trousers or shorts while shooting.
  - 4. No garment can be worn over the shooting uniform when in the act of shooting except in exceptional circumstances e.g., rainwear.
  - 5. The Board wish to stress where expenses are paid it is the requirement of all shooters to follow the team shooting uniform, failure to do so may result in the withholding of expenses due.
  - 6. From time to time there may be sponsors within Wales who may wish to provide Welsh team clothing. Should this be the case, in every instance this must be ratified in advance by the Board to ensure that both the WCTSA requirements and any specific advertising requirements of the international event are met.
- d. Welsh team dress uniform - to be worn at opening and closing ceremonies along with banquets etc.

The Wales team dress uniform, in which official team photographs are to be taken and which must be worn by all team members when requested by the team manager, is made up as follows:

- 1. Men - black blazer displaying the official Wales team blazer badge (wire), supplied by the WCTSA, on the breast pocket.  
Mid grey flannel trousers, white shirt with collar, Wales shooting team tie, grey socks, and black shoes.
  - 2. Ladies - black blazer displaying the official Wales team blazer badge (wire), supplied by the WCTSA, on the breast pocket.  
Mid grey skirt or trousers, white blouse with collar, Wales shooting team cravat and black shoes.
- e. Without exception relevant uniforms as described above must be worn at the appropriate times whilst representing Wales at all home internationals. At other



international events instructions issued by the WCTSA appointed team manager shall be obeyed by all team members. Failure to wear the correct uniform as instructed may exclude any member from taking part in the event and will subsequently result in disciplinary action being taken by the WCTSA against the member(s) concerned.

- f. International team members attending an event must make themselves available for any opening or closing ceremonies along with any specific photo opportunities, as well as any other duties to include HCIT banquets.

Failure to do so without any prior agreement of the team manager, or in their absence the board beforehand, may result in disciplinary action being taken and any expenses withheld.

Any of these requirements will be communicated to each team member by the designated Welsh team manager or through instruction from the Board by the General Secretary.

- g. Any expenses to be paid to international team shooters when sanctioned by the board will be done so electronically, and shooters are required to provide relevant bank details to allow secure electronic transfer of funds to their designated account. This requires shooters who qualify to shoot for the Welsh team to complete a basic contact information sheet supplied by the General Secretary with the information pack to ensure that the team captain and team managers can contact them.
- h. On successfully gaining a position on an International Welsh team for a sanctioned WCTSA event each team member will receive a pack from the General Secretary including all the requirements set out in these rules with regards to dress code and arrangements for the relative competition et cetera,
- i. Welsh Team Expenses
  1. For attending HCIT event and other specific events sanctioned by the Board, shooters where a Welsh Team has been entered, shooters may be paid a nominal amount towards their expenses. This will vary dependant on the geographic location and current Board finances.
  2. The amount of any expenses is at the discretion of the Board.
  3. Current expenses being paid can be found in Appendix 5.



4. Each team member will also be allocated a ticket for the after-shoot banquet, and it is a condition that shooters attend unless previous dispensation has been granted by the Board.
5. Shooters will also be reimbursed for gun permits required to travel to Ireland.

j. Welsh Team Accessories

From time to time the Board may sanction the production and sale of specific ancillary Welsh team or WCTSA branded accessories e.g., tracksuits, sweatshirts, dress shirts et cetera. Welsh Team accessories may only be worn/purchased by members who have shot for Wales or who are part of an official team that officially sanctioned international event. The Board reserves the right to amend review and alter items available for sale and their prices subject to agreement at minuted Board meetings. WCTSA branded items may be purchased by any current member



## 8. Welsh Team Manager Responsibilities

1. Team Managers for the coming year will be confirmed by the Board at the start of each year prior to any event being held requiring a Welsh team presence.
2. Team managers must be fully paid-up members of the association.
3. Applications for these posts must be made in writing to the WCTSA Board who will make the appointment.
4. The appointment is on a yearly rolling basis, with the understanding that this position is one of continual assessment by the board. If they feel the incumbent is not fulfilling the role on an annual basis then immediate notice of termination may be given following the home international event that year.
5. The position of Team Manager will normally preclude the post-holder from becoming a shooting member of the team and from shooting as an individual at an international event, except in special circumstances where prior consent from the WCTSA board has been obtained, when an Assistant Manager may be appointed.
6. For any other events in any other discipline in which an official Wales team participates the above rules may not necessarily apply, and in these instances Team Managers may be appointed at the discretion of the WCTSA board.
7. Responsibilities - these include but not necessarily limited to,
  - a. Compiling team shooters following the completion of the selection procedure and contacting shooters to ensure all are available for the relevant competition dates.
  - b. Ensuring that all team members are fully aware and equipped with the prescribed Welsh uniforms, both shooting and dress.
  - c. Liaising with all team members prior to an event to ensure that all travel arrangements have been completed and shooters are able to get to the relevant events and have applied for the relevant shooting permits, should they be required in the country to which they are travelling for the event.
  - d. Attending any organisational meetings of the events, e.g., administrative meetings, opening and closing ceremonies, photography sessions and banquets et cetera.
  - e. Convene and arrange team meetings where required.
  - f. Liaise with event hotels, if rooms held, and reserve rooms for Welsh shooters and pass details onto WCTSA Treasurer to pay a deposit if required.



- g. To ensure shooters are aware of event requirements such as opening and closing ceremonies, banquets, locations as well as start times etc.
- h. At the photography sessions for HCIT ensuring that a list is made, and monies taken all those team members requiring official team photographs.
- i. Being the conduit between the Board, the WCTSA Treasurer and General Secretary with regards to all other administrative duties such as partners banquet tickets et cetera.
- j. When attending events, the Team Manager shall qualify for expenses the same as is paid to a shooter plus a banquet ticket. Current expense rates can be found in Appendix 5.
- k. After any Welsh Team event the Manager will submit a shoot report to the Board for social media and the Website. This can be brief but must include a brief resume of the shoot and Welsh Team/Shooter performance.



## 9. County Team Selection Shoots

- a. The eligibility criteria, qualifying and the organisation of county finals is described in a separate policy 'WCTSA County Competition Rules'.
